Seven week Quarry strike now are members are dealing with a cement shortage. So to cap off this tuff year Concrete Contractors and Road Builders are struggling to get Concrete. Sewer Contractors are having problems getting Concrete Pipe & Concrete Manholes for storm sewer work. I'm being told by Concrete Suppliers that Cement producers are producing Cement at full capacity but they are selling the Cement out of state at a much higher cost in some cases triple what Cement sells for in northern Illinois. In the long run cement producers will get much more money for there product. In the short run they are killing the Concrete Industry in Northern Illinois. Many warehouse parking lots are being switched to Asphalt. Due to allocation some big floors are being delayed which causes cement Mason layoffs in good weather. In summary this has been a extremely difficult year to say the least. Hopefully the Concrete suppliers are proven wrong who say this Cement shortage will last well into 2023.

Remembering Gary Brieser

Gary Brieser, founder of Brieser Construction passed away peacefully on Saturday, October 22, 2022 at his home in Wilmington. Gary Brieser was a builder of not only bridges, foundations, and building, but a builder of relationships. Gary began working construction after college for Bill Davy as a draftsman at the Joliet Arsenal. In 1978, Gary went into business with his son Steve and created Brieser Construction Co. They focused on doing civil industrial construction and maintenance in the heavy industrial markets of Illinois, Wisconsin, Iowa, Michigan and Western Indiana; specifically maintenance, new construction project and pipeline support. Gary was a member of CAWGC, where he served as Vice Chairman from 1986 to 1987, and Chairman from 1988 until 1989. In addition, he served on the Government Relations Committee with Will County's Building Department and Storm water Management Committee. He was the Chairman of the Association's Labor Negotiations, and honored as member of the Year in 2001. He was instrumental in the founding of the Three Rivers Construction Alliance, acting as the Management Co-Chair starting in 1998. Gary also served on the Three Rivers Safety School Board from 1993 through 1998. Gary and his son bought 170 acres of property and started construction on a marina along the DesPlaines River called Breezy Harbor. Gary spent a big share of his time after retiring in early 2000 developing the property into a subdivision, Quarry PUD. Gary lived by the motto: G.ive more than you get. Give the other guy W.hat he wants. Leave things B.etter than you find them. Gary was an avid boater, travelling with his wife

Barbara Southall of 67 years and spending many weekends on the Kankakee River. Gary also loved owning and working on antique vintage vehicles. A familiar name in the construction industry. Gary will remain an inspiration and will be greatly missed by all and anyone who knew him.
